

Dr. Mohamed Namazie Ibrahim

Dr. Mohamed Namazie Ibrahim graduated from the Christian Medical College in 1972 and returned to Malaysia to serve in the University of Malaya Medical Center where he was trained in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care. He obtained his Fellowship from the Royal College of Anaesthetists in 1978 and worked as a lecturer in UMMC till he went into private practice in 1980 in his hometown Ipoh, Perak.

He joined a group of anaesthesiologists that served all the private hospitals in Ipoh including KPJ Specialist Hospital. After spending 16 years there he took up a management position with the Pantai Group of Hospitals as the Group Director of Medical Affairs for 3 years. Later he was appointed as a Consultant Anaesthesiologists at the North Western Armed Forces Hospital in Tabouk, Saudi Arabia. After returning to Malaysia he joined the Selangor Specialist Centre, which became the KPJ Selangor Specialist Hospital. He has been there since 2002. He also serves as member of the Clinical Governance Policy Committee of the KPJ Group of Hospitals.

While working in Perak he set up the first CPR training program and was instrumental for developing the nation's first Citizens CPR training Program under the auspices of MMA together with the team of instructors from Ipoh Specialist Center and the Hospital Ipoh. He led the team as Director of Training from 1986 till he relocated to Kuala Lumpur in 1998. The program that was started then is still being continued in several hospitals to this day.

Besides his professional work he has been involved with Malaysian Medical Association since 1978 and has occupied several positions in MMA Perak Branch including being the Chairman.

His involvement in MMA activities extended to national level as well.

Besides his involvement in MMA he has also served in other medical professional organizations. He had been the President of the Malaysian Society of Anaesthesiologists and the College of Anaesthesiologists of Malaysia.

At the international level he was the Vice Chairman of the Confederation of the ASEAN Societies of Anaesthesiologists, and Chairman of the Standing Committee on Standards in Anaesthesia of the Confederation. He has served as a Board member of the Association of the Private Hospitals of Malaysia, a surveyor of the Malaysian Society for Quality in Health for the accreditation of hospitals and as a volunteer with Mercy Malaysia and had participated in relief mission.

For his contribution to the leadership in medical organisations he was awarded an Honorary Fellowship of the Academy of Medicine of Singapore.

Currently he is the President of the Malaysian Medical Association and a Member of the Preliminary Investigation Committee of the Malaysian Medical Council
